

## **Hispanic Women in the United States, 2007**

*Revisions made to fact sheet on May 14, 2008*

Page 1: The second sentence of the first paragraph was changed to read: “This fact sheet describes the demographic, employment and income characteristics of Hispanic women in the U.S. using data from the 2007 Current Population Survey and the 2006 American Community Survey.”

The reference to the 2007 Current Population Survey under “Highlighted Characteristics of Hispanic Women” was deleted.

The following sentence was added to footnote 1:

Please see the “Data Sources” section for an explanation of how these estimates differ from the population totals derived from the CPS MORG, CPS March Supplement and ACS.

Page 2: Second bullet point, “largely” changed to “partially”.

The first sentence of footnote 2 was changed to read:

The fertility rate is defined as the number of women ages 15 to 44 per 1,000 women that age who reported having a child in the 12-month period prior to the survey.

Page 4, Data Sources: Two additional paragraphs and a table were added to the “Data Sources” section. This additional information explains how the population estimates released by the U.S. Census Bureau on May 1, 2008 differ from population totals derived from the data sources used in the fact sheet.

The “A Note on Numbers” header was added before the last paragraph.

Page 5: Fifth bullet point, “native-born” changed to “native born”.

Page 6: Table 1 title changed from “Birthplaces of Adult Hispanic Immigrant Women” to “Birthplaces of Adult Immigrant Hispanic Women”.

Page 7: First bullet point under Language, “speaks” changed to “speak”. The fourth sentence in the Figure 5 Note was changed to read: “For this analysis, anyone who spoke a language other than English at home and spoke English well, not well, and not at all were collapsed into one category—English less than very well.”

Page 8: The first sentence of footnote 2 was changed to read:

The fertility rate is defined as the number of women ages 15 to 44 per 1,000 women that age who reported having a child in the 12-month period prior to the survey.

Page 9, Table 2: The first sentence in the table Note was changed to read: “Fertility rate is defined as the number of women ages 15 to 44 per 1,000 women that age who reported having a child in the 12-month period prior to the survey.” Additionally, “past” was changed to “last” in the last column header.

Page 10: Second bullet point, “native born” changed to “native-born”. The title of Figure 8 was changed from “Educational Attainment of Immigrant Hispanic Women, by Country of Origin” to “Educational Attainment of Adult Immigrant Hispanic Women, by Country of Birth”.

Page 14, Definition of income groups box: The phrase “for a more detailed explanation of adjusted household income and income group assignments” was added to the end of the first sentence.

Pages 20 and 21, Appendix Tables 3 and 4: “Women with a birth in the past year” was changed to “Women with a birth in the last year”. The first sentence in the table Note was changed to read: “The fertility rate is defined as the number of women ages 15 to 44 per 1,000 women that age who reported having a child in the 12-month period prior to the survey.”
